⁹"Pray then in this way: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. ¹⁰Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. ¹¹Give us this day our daily bread. ¹²And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. ¹³And do not bring us to the time of trial, but rescue us from the evil one. ¹⁴For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you; ¹⁵but if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

¹⁶ And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. ¹⁷But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, ¹⁸so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

MORTGAGE BURNING LITANY

On August 4th, 2002 this congregation voted to build this sanctuary space. The completion of this space was celebrated on October 19th, 2003. And it inspires us toward new visions, dreams, and the further fulfillment of mission God gives us.


YOUTH 5th though 12th Grade are asked to help make the subs by showing up 8am on Sunday February 12th.

LITANY FOR OPENING OUR ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

L: Today our congregation gathers in hope as we begin another year of ministry.
